JUST SAV SOR

A DAUGHTER who says her mum was killed by a defective tumble dryer has still not received an apology - 15 months on.

Jodie Moloney, 31, is in a battle with maker Beko, which this week finally admitted the model, a DCS85W, used by her mum Mishell, 49, was faulty. Beko has also finally issued a warning on its website, saying that as

many as 3,450 of its branded tumble dryers may pose a fire risk. The 8kg and 9kg dryers – sold

between May and November 2012 have been linked to at least 20 blazes.

But Jodie says Turkish company Beko is still refusing to acknowledge that its dryer played any part in her carer mum's death on February 6 last year. Mum-of-two Jodie said: "They as good

Mum-ot-two Jodie said: "They as good as made a public apology this week but there has been nothing for my family.

"They have made no effort to say sorry to me. They have broken my heart.

"They have taken my mother away and a grandmother away from her grandchildren. It is a living nightmare." Mishell, of Rubery, Birmingham, bought the dryer in October 2012.

On the evening of February 6 last year she had turned it off in the kitchen and gone to bed, not realising it was smouldering, spreading deadly carbon monoxide fumes throughout her home. Jodie found Mishell dead in her

bedroom the next morning after she failed to respond to her calls.

At Mishell's inquest last August, coroner Emma Brown said she inhaled fatal levels of carbon monoxide created

by a fire in the dryer. She added: "The source for the fire was the printed control board.

"But it is not possible to identify the nature of the defect which caused it."

Jodie is lodging a claim for compensation from Beko for her brother Joshua, who was 16 at the time of the

tragedy and dependent on their mum. Jodie, of Solihull, said: "It's turned his life upside down. It's broken all of us.

"Mum will never be brought back but at least they should acknowledge what they've done and compensate me and my family... their machine took her life. So far an offer to cover funeral expenses

they are recalling them only now." Beko will send engineers to people's homes to repair models DCU9330W, DCU9330R, DCU8230W, TKF8439A and DSC85W – the one used by Mishell. A spokesman for Beko said: "In the days and weeks following this tragic incident, our team were in regular contact with the Moloney family to express our sympathies and regret, as well as ensuring we did all we could to help with the investigation into the cause of the fire. During this time we also offered to cover the funeral costs, however, this was not taken up by the family.

A message on Beko's website reads: "As a responsible manufacturer, we have decided to proactively contact the owners of these condenser tumble dryers to offer a free of charge in-home check and to modify affected products to remove any potential risk."

Five years ago Beko announced a recall on its 6kg and 7kg capacity tumble dryers, thought to have caused 100 fires. scoops@sundaymirror.co.uk

TOM Cruise has promised his Top Gun sequel will recapture the magic of the first movie – with Aviator sunglasses and music from the original.
